THORACENTESIS INSTRUCTIONS

You have been scheduled for a thoracentesis. Thoracentesis is a procedure to remove fluid from the space between the lining of the outside of the lungs and the wall of the chest.

You will be asked to sign a diagnostic consent form giving us permission to do the procedure. You do not need to fast prior to this procedure. You may need to have bloodwork prior to your procedure. If you are having your bloodwork done at a facility besides Penn Medicine/Lancaster General Health, please let us know so we can obtain the results prior to your appointment.

DURING THE PROCEDURE:

You will be given a local anesthetic during the procedure to make you comfortable. The procedure takes about 30 minutes. You will need to have a chest X-ray after the procedure has been completed and must be cleared by the physician before you can leave. You can expect to be here for 1 to 2 hours.

AFTER THE PROCEDURE:

You should be able to resume your normal activities after the procedure is done. If you were asked to stop any medications for the procedure, your physician will advise you when you can resume taking those medications after the procedure has been completed.
